A coin of King Cnut made in Bristol c1010. Anglo-Saxon coins were minted only in market towns, where they fed trade. 1067 Bristol surrenders to William

the Conqueror

1100



Bristol Castle built.
Brigstowe settlement
established on Castle
Park.

1200



This drawing is of dredging the reach in the 1820's; the original excavations might have looked something like this 1239 St. Augustin's Reach dug out and the Frome diverted to increase quay side.

1300



Plague in Bristol; at least 1/3rd of population dies.

1400



1497 John Cabot sails to Newfoundland on the Matthew.

1500



1552 Elizabeth I visits the city, calls St Mary Redcliffe church "the fairest and godliest in all the land"
1574 Society of Merchant Venturers formed

1654 Cromwell orders destruction of Bristol Castle

1698 Bristol officially joins the slave trade

#### 1700



From 1690 to 1807 British ships transport about 2.8 million enslaved Africans
